

What is All the Fuss about Gum Disease?

Everyone has heard about gum disease, but do you know what it is and why it's important to treat? The official name for gum disease is periodontal disease or perio for short. Perio is an infection that causes the loss of the bone that surrounds and supports the teeth. This bacteria that causes the infection creates harmful toxins that can enter your bloodstream and travel to other areas of your body, which increases the risk of stroke, heart attack, and diabetes. The bottom line is periodontal disease is caused by bacteria that live in the plaque and tarter on our teeth. However, certain factors can put you more at risk for developing periodontal disease, such as smoking, diabetes, poor homecare, recreational drugs and other health factors.

Perio can be treated but not cured. It is typically treated with a deep cleaning that includes antibacterial medication where the harmful bacteria and tarter is removed from beneath the gum. During periodontal therapy, we may also prescribe an antibiotic to help prevent the progression of the disease. If untreated you might experience tooth loss, greater risk of stroke or heart attack, uncontrolled diabetes, and women may have premature babies. Recent studies have also shown a direct link between Alzheimer's and periodontal disease.

Thankfully, our Hygienists are highly trained, so they can treat the disease and help you keep your oral hygiene at an ideal level. They are available to

answer all of your questions and make various recommendations that can improve your oral and whole body health.
